mission shaped ministry

Over 40 people met at the start of September to begin a learning journey together, a journey that will see us venture far from the fixed, solid shores

of the established church. It marked the start of *mission shaped ministry*, a course in planting and sustaining new expressions of church

(www.missionshapedministry.org).

Participants came from a wide variety of places: some serving ministers, some in training, some practitioners in new forms of mission and church from around Scotland. Many had a Church of Scotland background, but we also had participants from the Salvation Army, URC, Methodist and RC churches. Some of the discussions were fascinating, and I'm looking forward to many more!

Over the year ahead we'll be considering topics such as mission, culture, evangelism and leadership, assisted by local and national teachers including John and Olive Drane, Steve Hollinghurst and Peter Neilson. We'll learn from each other and through different learning styles, some presentation, film clips, activities, reflection, etc.

This course follows other Scottish courses that have run in Inverness and in Glasgow, with around 50 people taking part. Across the UK, there are more than 30 centres, with more than 1500 people enrolled, and a course has just started in Canada also. *mission shaped ministry* is a nationally recognised course and, while not

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presently university-accredited in Scotland, offers the chance to catch the wider vision of what God is doing across Edinburgh and Scotland. Plans are being put together for future courses, so if you are interested in attending a *mission shaped ministry* course, please get in touch.

mission shaped ministry is not the only training in pioneer ministry available in Scotland. The *Invest* course has been running for some time and deals with the material in greater depth, and in a more tailored context. *Invest* includes some assignments and a placement, which can be conflated with a "121" placement, and also includes a fantastic personal development track. A week-long course, *Invest Intense* is also available in February 2011. For more information
