The Fellowship Programme

Building on the success of the University's inaugural Chancellor's Fellowship recruitment programme in 2012, the University of Edinburgh intends to appoint up to 100 tenure-track Chancellor's Fellowships across the University's 22 Schools as a further major investment in the future of our teaching and research.

33 of these posts have been allocated to the College of Humanities and Social Science. The College comprises 11 Schools including the School of Divinity.

These prestigious awards are aimed at early independent research career individuals of the highest potential. It is essential that the successful candidate's research furthers the high international reputation of the School and the University and that she or he has a strong commitment to postgraduate and undergraduate training.

The tenure-track Fellowship will be held for 5 years. Subject to satisfactory review at the end of year 3, the Fellow will then move to a standard University academic open-ended contract.

The first year of the Fellowship will focus on establishing the Fellow's research programme, with a limited amount of teaching. Fellows will be expected to submit an appropriate number of high quality research outputs to REF2014. Teaching and administration will gradually increase over the 5 year period to that of a normal academic load in the relevant discipline and substantial mentoring and development support will be available through and beyond the Fellowship. A sufficient amount of teaching and administration will be required in the first 3 years to allow a judgement to be made on continuation to a full academic position.

Successful applicants will be appointed at Grade UE08, having completed their PhD and acquired equivalent relevant postdoctoral experience which meets the University Grade 8 Academic Job Profile.

The position will include an active role in our Centre for the Study of World Christianity, which embraces historical, theological and social scientific perspectives on Christianity in the majority world;
- **Biblical Studies**: the position will be located within the Biblical Studies Subject Area. Candidates should have primary competence in the Hebrew Bible or Old Testament;
- Theology, Ethics and Media Arts: applications from candidates with interdisciplinary expertise and publications will be particularly welcome (including specialisms in areas such as new/old media, or theology and the arts, and/or peacebuilding). The position will include

an active role in our Centre for Theology and Public Issues (CTPI), which promotes theological reflection and research on important public and global issues.
