The 500th anniversary of the birth of John Calvin (1509) will be closely followed by the 450th anniversary of the Scottish Reformation (1560). Drawn from different fields, each lecturer will examine the influence of the Reformation on a particular aspect of Scottish public life. Attention will be given to the Kirk and its doctrinal traditions as well as to its wider influence on political thought, literature, the visual arts and music.
