And farder intendis befoir Hir Majesteis returne from thyne to se a stay put to zour trowbillis. Quhat ze wald have doun in yir materis wryte zour mynd with sum freind bak vnto zour freindis heir in courte and we salbe willing to sett fordwarttis ye same. Zour bedfallow will declair zow ze maner how all thingis procedit heir.² Thair foir I will trowbill zow with na langar lettre at this tyme bot committis zow to ye keping of ye leving God. From Edinburgh ye xiij of Januar 1563.
