Quhom plesit to wit we writ to zou of befor anentis yis displesour and splwlze committit be our broder² apon zour landis and we wait nocht gif ze haif gottin ye said writting or nocht we traist ze knaw ye brwkolnes of ye man yat committit ye falt our mynd in sic materis and quhat we haif now ado instantlie of gret matteris yat rynis sa helie to our honor. Tharfor we pray zou effectouslie yat ze cum fordwart witt zour folkis conform to our last direction at our departing and wey yis mater wyisle and falze ws nocht at yis tyme considering ze knaw ye brukilnes of our broder and our gud mynd in sic behelfis. And be yis writ we promit fechtfullie to zou yat or zour departing fra ws ze and zour tenentis salbe restorit and saitifieit baith of ye skaith and ye displeseir sustenit be zou and zour tenentis be our broder and his complicis at yis tyme ye quhilk to do we obliss ws be yis our writ subscrivit with our hand. We haif schawin our mynd at lenth in yis mater to our servand Archibald MacKewir to quhom ze pless to gif credence. And Almychty God keip zou eternalie. Of Inveraray ye xviij day of October. Subscrivit with our hand.
