And zit I traist the yssue of the matter sall lett zou vnderstand I wes nocht forzetfull of zou as it is nocht my part in verray deid. I vnderstand that MacGregor is condiscendyt<sup>2</sup> to verray raisonable poyncts as ze will vndirst[and] be my Lord Ergyill my brother with quhome I haif bene als playn as ernist and zit wes bayth. I beseik zou pretermitt nocht<sup>3</sup> this occasion to putt zour self to eyse and thairthwith mak zow hable to do zour freyndis ane guid turn. 4 Yff I may forthir to zour contentement I sall omytt na thing that lyeyth in my pouer as evir ze list imploye me. Thankand hartly of zour guid treatment. And thus after my hartly commendation to zour Lady I committ zou to God. Frome Ayre ve xxiiij of August 1565.
