For giff they be bot requyr the Laird to find catio[un] ... sax dayis to undirlie ye law to ane langer [day I] think ze mister nocht bot to causs find ca[tio]un. Gif thay will nocht defar and betuix this and the day of law to caus labour freindlie. Alwayis I sall do that quar... that lyis in my powar.
