tyme for zour awin honour and for ye lorf yat ze hayd to my hous. And  
I trest in God and ze yat I salbe and oviss zour consall ass my fader  
and brodyr hes done of afore. Yarfore zour Masterschip sall tac saye mekle  
pane and expensis ass to be at my Lord in do tyme for my sayk and  
I vill lawbour and serve efter zour counsell to quhom I refer all my  
mynd quhill our mettyng. Eternall God to kyp zou. Of Dunbartan ye  
ye (sic) saxt daye Fabever
