Quhairfoir we desyre and pray zow effectuislie that with zour freindis servandis and substantious houshald in airmour addres zow to be heir in Edinburgh ye viii day of ye said moneth of October preparit to remaine during ye tyme of ye said parliament quhilk we traist sall nocht lang indiur as ze will declair zour obedience to ye Kingis auctorite zour affectioun to ye commoun caus yat is sa deir to vs all and will do ws maist acceptabill plesour. Sua we commit zow to God frome Edinburgh ye xxv day of September 1570.
