Quhilk I dout nocht bot ze will do in respect of the caussis foirsaid and to my sparing of zow ferder I think it bot my dwite to do zow all ye plesour and furtherance I can and gif ony vyer had bein in zour ... I vald nocht sparit sa lang. And yairfoir hoipis ze vill do diligens to further in ye rest ze suld do that zour compt ma be endit as saidis as I salbe reddy to do zow all ye plessour I can sa lang as I leif.
