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
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**Figure 1:** Percentage point difference in the probability of HE entry between students from upper-middle and working class background, Scotland



**Figure 2:** Effect of parental education on the probability of choosing subjects in upper secondary education (S5/S6), Scotland





**Figure 4:** Percentage point difference in the probability of HE entry between students from upper-middle and working class background, Scotland and Ireland


