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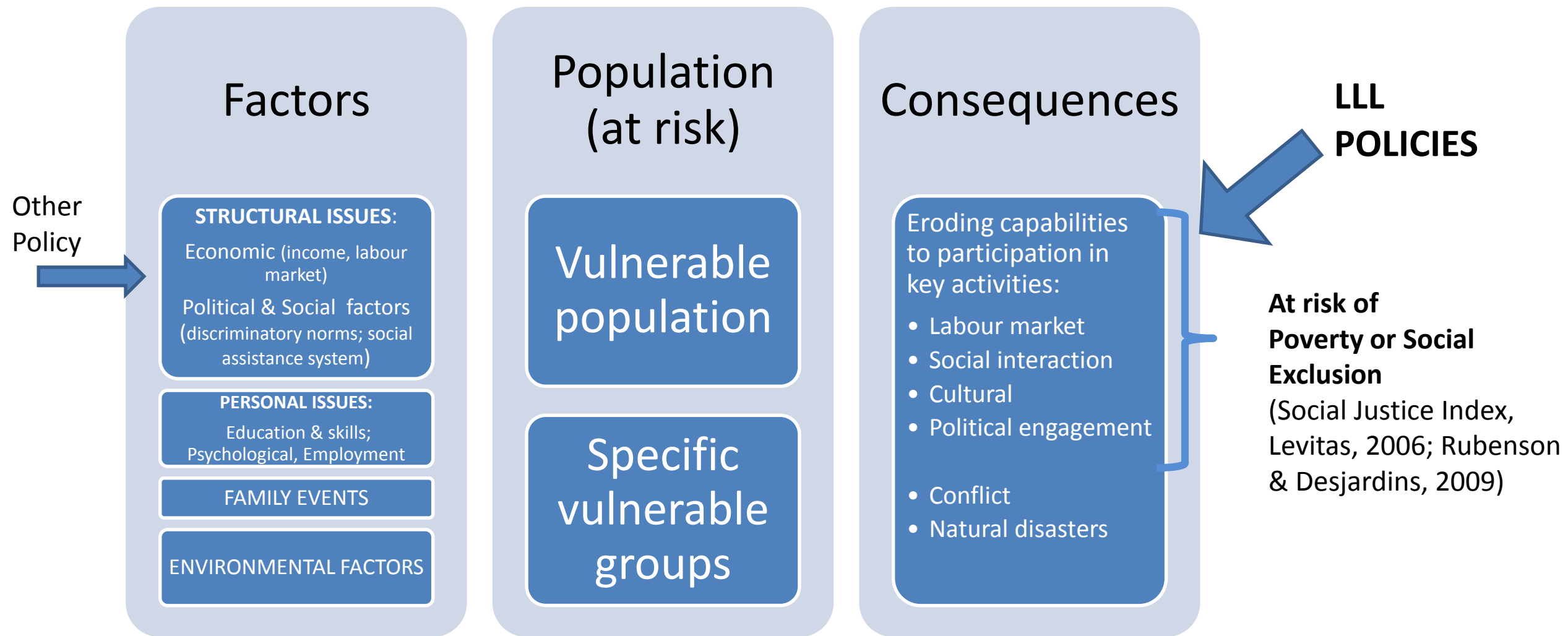

Categorisation of 7 types of LLL provision relevant to the project:

1. Basic skills and basic education
2. Second chance education at upper secondary levels
3. Post-secondary VET
4. Apprenticeships
5. Training that forms part of Active Labour Market Policies
6. Workplace and job-related learning
7. Personal or social learning



CASE STUDIES



School dropout leading to being low-qualified

→ second chances / alternative routes should be available ...

→ but ... low participation rates among the low-qualified!
